

# BRIEF ON THE CHANGES TO THE IMPORTS AND EXPORTS (CONTROL) ACT NO.1 OF 1969 IN AUGUST 2022

## INTRODUCTION

This is the 11<sup>th</sup> brief in a series that presents an analysis of the amendments to the regulations of the Imports and Exports (Control) Act. These briefs have been prepared since April 2020<sup>1</sup> with an aim to provide clarity and awareness of the changes to the Import and Export Regulations.

The 11<sup>th</sup> brief analyses the two (2) Gazettes that came into effect on August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2022 (refer below):

- Gazette I: Imports and Exports (Control) Regulations No. 12 of 2022 published in the Gazette
  Extraordinary No. 2294/29 dated 23 August 2022
- Gazette 2: Imports and Exports (Control) Regulations No. 13 of 2022 published in the Gazette Extraordinary No. 2294/30 dated 23 August 2022

## KEY TAKEAWAYS

- Gazette I made amendments to the Gazette issued on June 2022 (No. 2285/19); May 2022 (No. 2278/21); June 2021 (No. 2231/18); November 2017 (No. 2044/40); and February 2016 (No. 1953/28). These changes included leniency for projects outside the Board of Investment (BOI), Electric Bikes and Bicycles being removed from Temporary Suspension (TS) and placed into Import Control License (ICL), description changes, and changes to open account payment terms.
- Gazette 2 imposed further TS restrictions for the importation of certain goods. The Machinery/Electrical sector saw the highest number of goods being placed under TS in Gazette 2 with a share of 48%. This was followed by the Textile sector contributing 16%.
- The TS specified in Gazette 2 will be effective from August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2022, however, if those goods have been shipped on or before August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2022 (i.e., date of Bill of Lading/Airway Bill on or before August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2022) and arrived at the port of Sri Lanka on or before September 14<sup>th</sup>, 2022 will be allowed for customs clearance.
- Entities falling outside the Temporary Importation for Export Purposes (TIEP) scheme, reexports, and projects under section 17 of the BOI Act, can also request the Controller General of Imports and Exports, to import goods specified in TS, subject to the approval of the Minister of Finance on the recommendation of the Secretary to the Treasury, on a case-by-case basis.
- A total of 1,907 items as of August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2022 are under TS, which in our estimate is about 24% of total HS codes at 8-digit (tariff lines) in Sri Lanka. Machinery/Electrical (37%), Transportation (16%), and Textile (12%) are the key sectors that are in this category.

- 16% of items added to TS by Gazette 2 were previously under the ICL requirement implemented by the Gazettes issued on 9th March 2022 and April 9th, 2022, and were rescinded on May 31st, 2022.
- 34% of items added to TS by Gazette 2 were previously in the import restriction list requiring a credit facility of 90 days (C-90 days) and 180 days (C-180 days). The credit facility regulation was imposed through 10 Gazettes from April 2020 to June 2021. 47% of these matches were in Textile followed by Machinery/Electrical (24%).

### **KEY CHANGES OBSERVED**

#### <u>Gazette I</u>

Leniency for Special Projects outside the BOI Projects

Gazette I made amendments to the Gazette issued on June 2021 (No. 2231/18) for tiles and stones under HS heading 25.15, 25.16, 68.02, and 65.10 listed in TS to be imported for direct usage (only) of any approved condominium or mix development or hotel projects or Government projects, which do not come under the purview of BOI.

These importations are subject to the limit of quantities of tiles or stones as certified in the bill of quantities (BOQ) of such projects; under the Letter of Credit or Document Against Acceptance payment terms with a minimum of 180 days' credit facility.

This is subject to the approval of the Controller General of Imports and Exports Control, on the recommendation of the Secretary to the Treasury, and approval of the Minister of Finance, on a case-by-case basis.

For Government Funded Projects, the importation of construction vehicles can be allowed subject to the approval of the Controller General of Imports and Exports, on the recommendation of the Secretary to the Treasury.

A provision to make a request for payment terms under the Open Account Payment Term or Consignment Account Term for development projects approved by the Board of Investment or development projects, awarded by any Government entities, was made in Gazette I. This is subject to the approval by the Controller General, Department of Imports and Exports Control subject to the recommendation of the Secretary to the Treasury on a case-by-case basis.

#### **Bicycles and Electric Bikes**

Bicycles (HS 8712.00.90) and Electric Bikes (HS 8711.60.10) were removed from TS and added to the list of ICL subject to a fee of LKR 1,000 and LKR 4,000 for bicycles and electric bikes, respectively. Letter of Credit or Document Against Acceptance are the payment terms for importation of bicycles and electric bikes subject to a minimum of 180 days' credit facility.

#### Sugar under Open Accounts

The HS code of Cane Sugar (HS 1701.99.10) allowed under payment terms of Open Account / Consignment Account Permitted (OAP), was changed to the Cane Sugar HS code of HS 1701.99.20.

#### **Description Changes**

The following description changes for the goods specified in TS of the June 2021 Gazette, were made. The description amendments are highlighted in blue font.

## Gazette 2

Gazette 2 imposed further TS on the importation of 1472 goods. Our analysis showed that some of these items were previously under the ICL requirement implemented by the Gazettes issued on March 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and April 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022, which were rescinded on May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022.

While some were previously under the import restriction list requiring a credit facility of 90 days (C-90 days) and 180 days (C-180 days). The credit facility regulation was imposed through 10 Gazettes from April 2020 to June 2021.

However, in addition to entities under the TIEP, re-exports, and projects under section 17 of the BOI Act, where importation of items in TS is allowed, leniency has also been granted for other entities that do not fall under the above categories.

These entities will be allowed to import for direct use only (not for trading purposes), by the Controller General of Imports and Exports, on a case-by-case basis, subject to the approval of the Minister of Finance on the recommendation of the Secretary to the Treasury. A document fee will be charged for this process.

## **OVERVIEW OF THE SECTOR IMPLICATIONS**

The Machinery/Electrical sector saw the highest number of goods being placed under TS in Gazette 2 with a share of 48%. This was followed by the Textile sector contributing 16%. The table below provides a summary of the items that were subjected to TS.

Observing the overall restrictions (TS, ICL, and Banned) in sectors placed during the period from November 2017 to August 2022, most restrictions are in the Machinery/Electrical sector accounting for 22%. This is followed by the Transportation sector (19%), Textile (14%), and Chemical and Allied industries (14%).
