

# BRIEF ON THE CHANGES TO THE IMPORTS AND EXPORTS (CONTROL) ACT NO.1 OF 1969 IN MAY 2022

#### INTRODUCTION

This is the 10<sup>th</sup> brief in a series that presents an analysis of the amendments to the regulations on the Imports and Exports (Control) Act (since April 2020<sup>1</sup>). This brief analyses the Gazettes that were issued on May 6<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022 (refer below). In addition, the Customs Ordinance gazette too was analyzed given its relevance to the recent changes in the Import and Export (Control) regulations.

#### **KEY TAKEAWAYS**

- Gazette 1 imposed restrictions on payment terms under Open Account (OA) or Consignment Account, Documents against Acceptance (DA) and Documents Against Payments (DP) for the importation of goods.
- Gazette 2 rescinded the Gazettes issued on March 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and April 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022 imposing Import Control Licenses (ICLs) on imported goods.
- Gazette 3 extended the effective date of the open account ban for goods that arrived at sea ports and airports on or before June 07<sup>th</sup>, 2022.
- Gazette 4 imposed a customs duty surcharge on 75% of the products that were previously under the ICL requirement implemented by the Gazettes issued on March 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and April 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022. These ICL Gazettes as stated above were rescinded through Gazette 2.
- Observing the surcharge on customs duty, the highest increase in effective tax rate rates was seen in the machinery/electrical sector followed by the food sector and miscellaneous sector,

which comprises of goods such as furniture, sunglasses, gaming devices, keyboard instruments, etc.

## **KEY CHANGES OBSERVED**

#### Gazette 1

- This Gazette covers overall imports without any separation on HS codes and is applicable to the most frequently used payment terms i.e. Open Account or Consignment Account, DP and DA payment terms shipments.
- It is observed that a large amount of trade has been on the above-stated payment terms covering all imports, especially including essential goods and raw materials for manufacturing. These changes would put further controls on imports creating shortages of items/products in the market while expecting to save the country's limited foreign exchange.

## **Key Changes**

- 1. Under Gazette regulation No 4 Open Account payment shall be only be allowed to;
  - a) Exporters paying for the importation of goods for their export purposes through their business Foreign Currency (FC) account or offshore FC account
  - b) Local suppliers, supplying goods for exporters, receiving payments in FC received to their Business Foreign Currency (BFC) account of offshore FC account
- 2. An importer under the Gazette regulation No 4, will adhere to the following when clearing goods;
  - a) Importer shall get his Invoices endorsed by his bank confirming that he has required funds in his FC or offshore FC account for payments
  - b) Such endorsed commercial invoices should be submitted for shipment clearance.
- 3. Any importer except referred under Gazette regulation No 4, when transacting under DP or DA terms, should obtain prior approval on the relevant proforma invoice from his bank prior to the "shipped on board date" of the bill of lading (BL), and such endorsed PFI, together with other documents would be required for shipment clearance
- 4. Any licensed banks when settling payments under Open Account or Consignment Accounts, should share payment details electronically to the Director General of Customs (DGC) relating to every Customs declaration (CUSDEC)
- 5. All violations of the above regulations would be dealt with under the provisions of the Customs Ordinance
- 6. For any issues related to the interpretation of this regulation should be referred to the Controller General of Imports and Exports.
- 7. This regulation does not cover blanket approvals for shipments, partial shipments, and timelines for bank approvals or shipment periods.

## Transacting under DP or DA terms

• The traditional DA or DP terms suggests that all documents should be channeled through the supplier's and importer's bank account.

#### Gazette 2

- This Gazette effective from June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022, rescinded the Gazettes issued on March 9<sup>th</sup> 2022, and April 9<sup>th</sup> 2022 imposing Import Control Licenses on imported goods. Therefore, the goods specified in the Gazettes will no longer be under ICL regulations. Please refer to our last brief, which demonstrated the goods that came under ICL regulations<sup>2</sup>.
- Therefore, goods imported during the period from March 10<sup>th</sup>, 2022 to May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022 without an ICL were authorized to be released from Customs.

#### Gazette 3

- This Gazette, postponed the effective date of banning the importation of goods under Open Account payment terms (specified in Gazette 1) by two weeks to June 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022.
- Based on requests from the trade, the Ceylon Chamber made submissions to the policymakers
  requesting rationalization of the operative date on banning Open Account transactions. Since,
  currently, there are many shipping delays experienced globally resulting in long lead times for
  import consignments.
- The Imports and Exports Controller General has stated that the Department has informed DGC to consider any goods that may arrive after 7 June on a case-by-case basis and may allow goods shipped from long distances or subject to unforeseeable delays during shipment to be released, subject to a Customs penalty.
- The Gazette also allows the Imports and Exports Controller General to issue operating instructions to banks simplifying the procedures for imports under open accounts for reexportation.

## Gazette 4

• This Gazette that came into effect on June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022, imposed a customs duty surcharge on 75% of the products that were previously under the ICL requirement implemented by the Gazettes issued on March 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and April 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022. These ICL Gazettes as stated above were rescinded through Gazette 2.

## **OVERVIEW OF THE SECTOR IMPLICATIONS**

The machinery/electrical sector saw the highest number of goods coming under a customs duty surcharge with a share of 26% followed by the food sector (21%) and the miscellaneous sector (17%), which comprises of goods such as furniture, sunglasses, gaming devices and keyboard instruments. The Chemical and Allied industry and Metal industry had a share of 6% each. The table below provides a brief summary of the items that were subjected to a Surcharge of Customs Duty from June 1st, 2022.
